Presently the College Provides Honours Level under graduate courses in 15 subjects in Economics , Education, English ,Hindi ,History, Home science, Odia, Political Science, Sanskrit, Sociology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Zoology, and Commerce. Except general under general Graduate Courses .The College also provides some certificate and Diploma Add-on- Courses. The College has been Affiliated to UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act and has completed first Cycle of accreditation by NAAC in the Year 2007.

### **Industrial visit:-**

In 2019, 7 students from physical science visited Hari Udyog private limited on 06.01.2020 to see the sectional work related to plasto chemical products. Students' queries were clarified by the technicians. In the same academic year 44 students of Biological science also visited Hari Marine Entrepreneur farm on 27.12.2019. They visited all marine sectors as well as agricultural plots. 11 students were taken to visit SROSTI Incubation Centre to see various scientific models and plant culture. They assisted in preparation of Incubation Model in the college.

### **Gender Sensitization and Women Empowerment Programme**

The college organized a number of gender sensitization program in this year by arranging workshop, seminar, discussion, symposium and counseling. International Women's Day was celebrated on 08.03.2020 in the Conference Hall of the College by NSS and YRC units and women empowerment cell in which 98 students participated. The meeting which was presided over by the principal of the college focused on the dignity of women, their sacrifice, service, nursing, caring, protection of law and promoting govt. programs through interaction among members on the dais and the students.

A program on Digital India for Women was undertaken on 12.11.2018 in the college in which students were made aware of digitalization of all services. 42 women students participated in the program. The role and responsibility in this field on the eve of Digital India proclamation by our prime minister was mainly discussed by the expert resource persons.

The college organized a seminar on Gender Equality on 02.03.2020 which was presided over by the principal with Mamata Mohapatra, President Yugashree Yuganani joined as resource person. 70 numbers girl students participated. The R.P. Smt. Mahapatra explained the role of women in 21<sup>st</sup> century and how women are being placed in the high positions in the present scenario. In a nutshell she said position of women should not be considered on the basis of gender rating. It should be understood on the basis of potentiality.

### **Legal Awareness:-**

A workshop was organized on 11.02.2020 by the institution to make aware young students about the cyber related crimes and the law available for remedy. The meeting was presided over by the principal of the college. The District Legal Service authority extended their wholehearted support to make the program successful. Justice Ajay Ku Mohanty delivered a beautiful lecture on cyber crime and how the youth are being affected due to lack of knowledge. Justice Sukumar Mohapatra, Secretary Legal Cell made the students aware about the legal provisions and mentioned the noted cases to bring to the attention of the students. 77 nos of students participated in the workshop.

### **Cultural Activities :**

During 2019-20 session cultural week was observed to inspire the literary and cultural talents among them through Talent Hunt Program. It was held in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> week of December. All other winners were awarded with certificate and prizes.

During the year a student named, Kumari Biswabandenee Behera, Id no BA-18-003 secured one cultural award at the National Solo Dance Competition for outstanding performance. The inter college cultural competition was organized by the college where nos. of students from different colleges participated.

### **Awarness Programme on Tuberculosis**

An Awarness Programme on Tuberculosis was held on 20.02.2020. in which Dr. Sarthak Das Mohapatra ,District Co-ordinator and Rajesh Kumar Das STS, Gopalpur CHC attended as Recourse person .

To them Tuberculosis is a bacterial infection spread through inhaling tiny droplets from cough of an infected person. It mainly affects the lungs, bones , and other organs.67 nos of students attended the Seminar a part from the staff of the college .

### **Health Check-up Camp**

A Health Check-up Camp was organized in the college premises on 18.12.2019. In which health of 75 patients was checked up and medicine was distributed, prescribed Dr. Suraj Jena M.O.of Barahmpur PHC was invited to conduct the camp. Pharmacist of Durga medicine store assisted to make the camp successful.

In which 83 patients were given Homoeopathic medicine and some medicines were prescribed by the Doctor to purchase fro outsides. Dr . A team of Homeopathic practitioner assisted him .NSS and YRS volunteers helped the Doctor and his teams to make the programme successful. It was highly appreciated by the local public.

### **1. Curricular aspects:**

Yoga therapy and human health and teaching of Bhagbat Gita has a certificate course was introduced on 01.08.2017. its duration was 180 days. Its focus was on employability i.e. making Yoga teaches with physical nourishment skill.

The college has value added course imparting transferable and life skill. The course is teaching of Bhagabat Gita for noble life and personal enrichment it was introduced on 21.08.2017. No. of students enrolled in 15.

The college has undertaken field projects by the B. Sc. students.16 B. Sc. students visited Plasto Chemical Industry, Hari Plast and 32 B. Sc. students visited hatching and processing centre, Hari Merine, Balasore.

College has a structure feedback relived from students, Teachers, Alumni, Parents and employer's feedbacks are obtained, analyzed for overall development of the institution.
